

Accurate Astrophysical Correlations Link the Mathematical Structure of the Maya Long Count Calendar, and the Egyptian Pyramids at Giza to the Alpha Centauri Star System

ABSTRACT

In the 1960s, Carl Sagan proposed several tests that might be applied to evidence of contact by extraterrestrials in ancient times. Sagan's "tests" focused on two broad categories of evidence; cultural artifacts and "accounts" recorded in myths, legends, folklore and religious texts. To date there are few published reports of any investigator attempting to apply Sagan's tests to material or cultural artifacts originating in ancient cultures.

It has been argued elsewhere, that Sagan's "tests" seem in some instances to be too specific (and thus too limited in scope for general use), and in other instances not specific enough. Extracting and synthesizing key concepts from the proposed tests, they have been restated in a manner that results in their encompassing a broader range of plausible evidence and providing a greater specificity of standards for the evaluation of such evidence. The evidence to be presented and evaluated below appears to meet the standards set forth in Sagan's proposed "tests".
